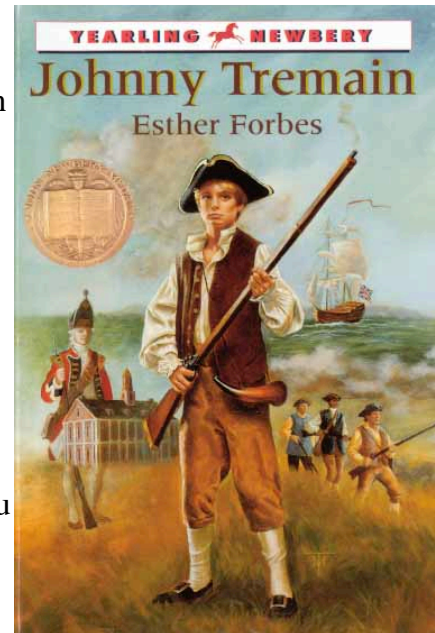
## "Johnny Tremain" – Novel Project

### Part One: 50 pts - POEM

You will read your poem out loud in class and turn in a typed copy to the teacher. The poem should contain at least 14 lines. It does not need to rhyme, though you may make it rhyme if you wish. You can include names of historical figures and events from the Revolutionary War. However, the most important element of the poem is to **convey the spirit or emotions of the colonists.**
